Due to the Leverage effect, the value of a warrant changes more than the value of the Underlying. The value of a Put Warrant generally decreases when the price of the Underlying increases. The value of a warrant may also decrease if the price of the Underlying remains unchanged because the time value and/or volatility decreases or supply and demand develop unfavorably.
